DRESS CODE

AVAILABILITY OF DRESS CODE ITEMS

- School Uniform may be purchased from our supplier by direct order. Order forms are on the school website. Sample sizes are available in the School Uniform Exchange. Enquiries meldie@downsdrapery.com.au
- Second-hand school clothes are available from the School Uniform Exchange Shop (when stocks permit). Open fortnightly on Wednesdays 3-3.30pm or by arrangement.
- School Hats and Bags are available from the Uniform Exchange.

MODIFICATIONS TO THE DRESS CODE

- Parents of students who for ethnic, religious or health reasons, may wish to modify the school dress code, are required to discuss such modifications with the principal. Staff will be informed of any student granted a modification to the dress code.

FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES

- Students whose families experience financial difficulties regarding the purchase of a school uniform should contact the principal to discuss the situation.

NON-COMPLIANCE

WHERE A STUDENT DOES NOT FOLLOW THE DRESS CODE, THE PRINCIPAL WILL -

- Encourage the wearing of school uniform with discussion centered on the benefits and positive aspects of a dress code.
- Contact the parent / care-giver.
- Provide assistance / support in obtaining suitable clothing where necessary.

IF A STUDENT DOES NOT COMPLY WITH A REQUIREMENT OF THE DRESS CODE AS A RESULT OF THE ABOVE, AND IS NOT EXEMPTED, THEN THE PRINCIPAL MAY -

- Prevent the student from attending any activity where the student would have been representing the school.
- Prevent the student from attending or participating in any school activity which, in the opinion of the principal, is not part of the essential education program.

Information for Parents and Students

INTRODUCTION

The School Council has established a dress code for all students attending this school according to Section 128(d) of the School Education Act 1999.

By enrolling your child/children in our school you are entering into an agreement to abide by the policy that governs the uniform of City Beach Primary School based on Education Department of WA guidelines (June 1997).

RATIONALE

The School Council believes a school dress code:

- Fosters and enhances a school and team spirit.
- Assists in building a school and team spirit.
- Ensures students are safely dressed for specific school activities.
- Encourages equity among students.
- Instills pride in personal presentation.
- Identifies students within the local community.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS FOR CITY BEACH PRIMARY SCHOOL

The school colours of red, white and black are represented by the following items of clothing.

They are available from our Supplier via direct order form. Copies available on the school website.

Summer Uniform

- Red school polo shirt
- Grey skorts (girls) or grey drill shorts (boys)
- Girls' Polyester school dress (alternative to skort and polo shirt)
- School sandals or sports joggers with white socks
- White school hat

Winter Uniform

- Red school polo shirt
- Plain black trackpants
- Red school jumper / Black school vest
- Sports Joggers with white socks

Sports Uniform

- Interhouse sport: Polo tee-shirt in house colours (Dampiera Blue, Zamia Green, Acacia Gold)
- Interschool sport: Red school polo shirt.
- Girls—Black school shorts. Optional black trackpants in winter.
- Boys—Black shorts. Optional black trackpants in winter.
- Sports Joggers with white socks
- White school hat

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Students should ensure that they take appropriate action to protect them from the sun when outdoors. The **NO HAT, NO PLAY** school policy applies in terms 1 and 4, although hats are encouraged at all times. White broad brimmed hats are available from the School Uniform Exchange shop. Students who do not wear a hat during terms 1 and 4 will be restricted to the gazebo during recess and lunch breaks. During sport they will be placed in a supervised, shaded area.
- No thongs, health or beach sandals are permitted. Appropriate school shoes or school sandals are to be worn.
- Appropriate sports joggers are those designed to give adequate support during sports activities and do not include skateboard, Converse, Volleys or other fashion sportswear. They are to be predominantly white with minimal markings.
- Jewellery: Neck chains are discouraged. For safety reasons, children may wear the following items of jewellery only:
 - Earrings - studs and sleepers only.
 - A watch.
- Students with long hair (shoulder length) are to have it tied back.
- No make-up is to be worn by students.
